Say Goodbye to SCL Rate Increases: Go Solar!



As you've likely already learned, Seattle City Light (SCL) announced its rate hikes this week and are estimating that customers will see a **5.4% cost increase** in each of the next two years, with an expected 5% bump in the years that follow.

These numbers are considerably higher than the original 3% increase SCL had forecast. According to a <u>recent article</u> in the Seattle Times, these increases are due to greater demand, extreme weather events, and volatile pricing in the open energy market.

Energy efficiency continues to be top of mind for many of us in our region and these growing costs underline the fact that **there's never been a better time to consider going solar**, or adding battery backup to your existing system.

Imagine getting rid of your electricity bill without changing any of your consumption. You can do that with solar. You can also eliminate the need to rely on the grid for power when outages occur, by adding battery storage to your home.
